COP SLOT

ACPO Summer Drink/Drug Drive Campaign is running from 1st - 30th June.

Did you know that there were.....

269 - People killed or injured on Nottinghamshire roads during 2008 in collisions involving drivers who were impaired by alcohol and/or drugs.

2800 - Drivers have been breath tested so far this year (January-April 2009) by Nottinghamshire Police officers.

455 - Of the drivers breath tested in Nottinghamshire have been arrested for excess alcohol or for failing to provide specimens.

20% - Of those arrested 1 in 5 were more than 2 ½ times above the permitted alcohol limit.

23% - Of those arrested 23% on average are Repeat Drink Drive Offenders

The Police can subject you to a breath test if you are involved in RTC (which is a Nottinghamshire Police and ACPO requirement at all times) and if you are stopped for a Moving Traffic Offence. And they can use their powers to require a suspected driver to take a Preliminary Field Test if other substances are suspected.



The message is Nottinghamshire Police will not tolerate drivers who are under the influence of drink or drugs.



NEW NRG SET FOR THE FIRST MEETING

I have been asked to join the new NRG committee to represent the thoughts and feelings of the members of the IAM.



I am honoured to be asked to be one of eighteen members of the IAM representing all the regions around the country. We are there to try to make changes in the way the IAM works and runs. By trying to make changes to policy and bringing fresh eyes to the table.

Here is what the IAM Chairman David Kenworthy had to say about it.

“This month (Saturday 13 June 2009) at Warwick University, the IAM will host the inaugural Meeting, of the new National Representatives Group. Chairman David Kenworthy has said that this is a major change for the IAM, designed to ensure greater involvement for Groups.

Here he answers a few questions to explain how the NRG will work.

How will the regional structure work?

With over 200 Groups, it would be difficult to meet regularly with all the chairs or secretaries. We do that at the annual conferences. However, the regional structure lends itself to focussed meetings to be held more often.

What happened to the NGC?

The NGC as it was constituted has now ceased. The NGC members have been a great asset to Council and the IAM and I wish to thank them for all their hard work. They will be invited to play a different role with Peter Rodger. Who will chair the new NRG group?

In future I will chair regular meetings of Regional Chairs and/or Secretaries. Regular attendees will include the

Managing Director, Simon Best, the Chief Examiner, Peter Rodger and two Council Members, Mike Lyne and David Horton. But what exactly will the NRG do?

The NRG's terms of reference are: Provide a forum for debates, feedback and guidance on: A joined-up approach to achieving the aims and goals of the organisation as a whole Communications between IAM House and Groups and between Groups IAM future strategies and initiatives and feedback on the performance of the organisation against these strategies To recommend IAM Group policy and development to IAM Council To identify possible IAM Policy and Research projects and discuss the best communication process for the Groups To advise on Group standards and best practice sharing Any other matters referred to

the NRG by IAM Council

How often will it meet?

The NRG will meet at least three times a year. The NRG will report annually on its work programme, activities and progress made in achieving its objectives during the year. This report will be included as part of the IAM annual report, with updates at the annual car and motorcycle conference.”

As you all know, Nick Ireland has been our hub of entertainment this year again, even though he took on the extremely busy roll this year of the associate co-ordinator.



Well that's all for now.






